Cookies

In order that we can provide you with a better user experience we sometimes place small data files on a user's computer, laptop, tablet or mobile phone known as cookies. These data files do not store personal information about you, but merely about the choices you make when navigating our website and are used purely for analytical purposes.

The way we use cookies on our websites:

Analytics – eg how visitors use our website

We use Google Analytics, Adobe SiteCatalyst and Idio Analytics and Personalisation to store information about how visitors use our website in order that we may make improvements and provide visitors with a better user experience.

Google Analytics and Adobe SiteCatalyst are third party information storage systems that record information about the pages you visit, the length of time you were on specific pages and the website in general, how you arrived at the site and what you clicked on when you were there. These cookies

do not store any personal information about you eg name, address etc and we do not share the data. You can view their respective privacy policies below:

The Idio service helps us analyse how visitors use our Website and recommend relevant content to you. We use the Idio service to record, on an anonymous basis, information such as page views, mouse clicks on our email communications as well as non-personally identifiable information text you type in this website. Idio does not create a user profile for the purpose of tracking a user across unrelated websites and will only use such information pursuant to this Privacy Policy.

Internet based Advertising: We use Google Analytics tracking code to support Google Display Advertising features such as Re-marketing to inform, optimise, and serve ads based on your past visits to our website or on our adverts.

You can opt-out of the Google Analytics Advertising Features you use, including through Ads Settings, Ad Settings for mobile apps, or any other available means (for example, the NAI's consumer opt-out). Google Analytics' [opt-outs for the web](#).

Examples of cookies set:

Google Analytics

- **Cookie Name:** `_utma`; **Typical content:** This cookie is typically written to the browser upon the first visit to your site from that web browser. If the cookie has been deleted by the browser operator, and the browser subsequently visits your site, a new `__utma` cookie is written with a different unique ID. This cookie is used to determine unique visitors to your site and it is updated with each page view. Additionally, this cookie is provided with a unique ID that Google Analytics uses to ensure both the validity and accessibility of the cookie as an extra security measure.; **Expires:** 2 years
- **Cookie Name:** `_utmb`; **Typical content:** This cookie is used to establish and continue a user session with your site. When a user views a page on your site, the Google Analytics code attempts to update this cookie. If it does not find the cookie, a new one is written and a new session is established. Each time a user visits a different page on your site, this cookie is updated to expire in 30 minutes, thus continuing a single session for as long as user activity continues within 30-minute intervals
- **Cookie Name:** `_utmc`; **Typical content:** this cookie operated in conjunction with the `__utmb` cookie to determine whether or not to establish a new session for the user; **Expires** as soon as you exit your browser
- **Cookie Name:** `_utmz`; **Typical content:** This cookie stores the type of referral used by the visitor to reach your site, whether via a direct method, a referring link, a website search, or a campaign such as an ad or an email link. It is used to calculate search engine traffic, ad campaigns and page navigation within your own site. The cookie is updated with each page view to your site and expires after 6 months

SiteCatalyst

- Cookie Name: s_cc; Typical content: This cookie stores a true or false value based on if the user has cookies enabled or not and is a session based cookie which means it expires when the browser is closed
- Cookie Name: s_sq; Typical Content: This cookie contains information about the previous link that was clicked on by the user and is also a session based cookie that expires when the browser is closed
- Cookie Name: s_vi [ID]; Typical Content: This cookie simply remembers the user and the time/date of visit and is a persistent cookie that lasts for approx 2 years

General Session Cookie set by our website:

- Name: Asp.net_sessionid; Typical content: randomly generated text that is session based and expires as soon as you close your browser

IP addresses

- An IP or Internet Protocol Address is a unique numerical address assigned to a computer as it logs on to the internet. Simpson Millar LLP do not have access to any personal identifiable information and we would never seek this information. Your IP address is logged when visiting our site, but our analytic software only uses this information to track how many visitors we have from particular regions.

Cookie - Consent

Using the Cookie Control

You may have noticed a diamond shape image appearing in the bottom left hand corner of our website. This is a cookie control which informs you what type of cookies are being set.

Please note that if you turn off cookie consent using the Cookie Control it will insert a cookie to remember that you have revoked consent called "civicAllowCookies".

Giving or removing consent using your browser

You are completely in control of cookies stored on your device and can view/delete them at any time using settings in your browser, for instance, to refuse all cookies in:

- IE Browsers click "Tools", "Internet Options", "Privacy", and choosing "Block all cookies"
- Google Chrome Browsers click "spanner icon", "Settings", "under the bonnet", "content settings" and then choosing "Block sites from setting any data"
- Firefox browsers click "Tools", "Options", "Privacy" and ticking the option to not track you etc
- Safari browsers click "Settings", "Preferences", "Privacy" and selecting the appropriate cookie options

- Mobiles – open up the internet, select "settings" then look under the "privacy" section to adjust your cookie settings

Note: Obstructing all cookies could, however, have an adverse impact upon the usability of this website and many others on the internet.
